

Some students may have published their research elsewhere. To honor these students and to spread information about the research, an author can summarize the scope and main results of his/her research in 'Spotlight'. Please note that this column is available for students only, that are the first or second author of an article published elsewhere. To prevent for plagiarism, it is very important that this narrative report cannot be an exact copy of the abstract in the original article.

To submit:

A narrative report about the highlights of your research, including:

- **Title**
Your title must be different than the title of your original manuscript.
- **Aim and research question**
Briefly explain the relevance of your research and mention your research question or hypothesis.
- **Methods**
Briefly mention the kind of research you performed, investigated patients, main materials used and outcomes.
- **Main results**
Answer your research question
- **Conclusion**
This may not be an exact copy of the conclusions in your abstract of the original article. Also, don't repeat the results you mentioned above in the results section, but put your results in perspective. What can be learned from your results? What should be changed (and how) based on your results? Has your research led to new insights in the area of your research?
- **Reference to the original article**
