

Every month many scientific articles are published, one more groundbreaking than the other. As medical student, it is therefore difficult to stay up-to-date for each discipline. With this item, we will keep students up-to-date with recent published, groundbreaking studies.

Requirements:

- Write a short section about a recent published, groundbreaking article that is:
 - Interesting and useful for a medical student
 - In your discipline as reviewer
 - Maximum 3 months published
- Write only about 1 article
- Maximum word count: 200
- Please mention your affiliations as follows
 Author1¹, Author2¹
¹Department of Surgery, Amsterdam UMC location AMC, University of Amsterdam
- No tables or figures are allowed, images in consultation with the editor-in-chief
- Please reference to the original article using AMA style
- If the study is performed in a foreign country, describe to what extent the news will impact the Dutch health care system.
- To prevent for plagiarism, it is very important that this news section cannot be an exact copy of sentences of the referenced article.

Tips:

- The title usually describes the subject matter of the article (e.g. “Potatoes as a cure for diabetes”) but sometimes it is more effective to have a title that summarizes the results (e.g. “A potato a day keeps diabetes away”).
